

Activating the Body of Christ in Service.

The "Be the Church" campaign was designed to activate the body of Christ in meaningful action. By engaging members of Moments of Hope Church, we encouraged them to connect with service opportunities that allowed them to be the hands and feet of Christ in their communities. Throughout the campaign, we highlighted individual service stories in a weekly **September Service Spotlight**, showcasing the difference one person can make. The campaign culminated in a **Connect Fair**, where n of our partner organizations were on hand to meet and engage with church members. This event was a powerful reminder of the collective impact we can have when we come together.

CROSS-COLLABORATION

Building Bridges to Learning

One of the most inspiring moments this quarter was our *Building Bridges to Learning* event, which truly embodied the spirit of collaboration. With the help of **102** volunteers, we served **286** families by distributing **602** backpacks and providing **411** sets of school supplies to students in need. The event welcomed over **800** individuals, creating an environment of support and encouragement as families prepared for the new school year. This cross-collaborative effort not only addressed immediate needs but also strengthened the bonds between our partner organizations and the communities we serve.

A STORY OF COLLABORATION:

Strengthening Our Impact Together

This quarter, *City of Hope* has witnessed the incredible power of collaboration, as numerous partner organizations came together to serve our communities more effectively. These partnerships have allowed our partners to expand their reach, provide essential resources, and create meaningful experiences for individuals and families across multiple neighborhoods.

Progressive Baptist, who shared their vans with Learning Help Center for field trips, ensuring that students had safe and reliable transportation to enriching experiences. This seemingly small act had a profound impact, allowing children to explore new environments and engage in learning outside of the classroom.

Vizion Church played a pivotal role in deepening outreach in neighborhoods such as 1701 City View, Stonewall Jackson, and Cambridge Park. Their passion for service and spreading Christ's love has been instrumental in enhancing support in these areas. Through their efforts, we have been able to touch more lives and build stronger community ties.

A particularly exciting development this quarter was the Lowes Hometown grant, which was awarded to *A Better World*. This grant has allowed them to renovate their computer labs, furthering their ability to provide educational support to children. The collaboration between A Better World and Learning Help Communities extended to a shared adventure, as they embarked on an end-of-summer trip to Atlanta, fostering fellowship and joy among the children.

Faith, Hope, and Love's partnership with SWStem Academy and Movement School continues to grow, with more students joining their programs. This expanding collaboration highlights the importance of shared efforts in providing educational opportunities to underserved children.

Learning Help Communities also benefited from multiple collaborations during their summer camp, working with partners such as the YMCA, youth volunteers from the NC School for Science and Math, the Mayor's Youth Initiative, and Liberty Kids. These partnerships enabled them to offer a rich and diverse camp experience, complete with meals provided by Liberty Kids, and a first-ever reward trip to Atlanta, in partnership with A Better World. This adventure offered not just fun, but valuable time for building relationships and strengthening community bonds.

Each of these partnerships has been integral to our mission, demonstrating the extraordinary outcomes that can be achieved when organizations come together. Through cross-collaboration, we have been able to expand our services, reach more families, and provide critical resources to those who need them most. *Together, we are creating lasting change in the communities we serve, one partnership at a time.*


PILLAR: READING


PILLAR: DISCPLESHIP
